**ATLANTA SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA TO PERFORM “BOND AND BEYOND”  
MARCH 16–17, 2012**

**James Bond-Themed Program To Replace  
Previously Scheduled Marvin Hamlisch Concert**

**Principal Pops Conductor Michael Krajewski To Lead Spy Movie Favorites,  
Including “From Russia With Love,” “You Only Live Twice,” and Others**

**Program To Feature Broadway Vocalist and Tony Award-Winner Debbie Gravitte**

The Atlanta Symphony Orchestra will perform “Bond and Beyond” — a spy-themed program featuring a variety of James Bond themes in addition to classic songs from other spy films — March 16–17, 2012, at 8:00 p.m., in Atlanta Symphony Hall at the Woodruff Arts Center. This concert replaces the previously scheduled Marvin Hamlisch program, as Mr. Hamlisch is unable to travel due to illness.

Principal Pops Conductor Michael Krajewski will lead the Orchestra in a variety of James Bond movie themes, including “From Russia with Love,” “You Only Live Twice,” and “Goldfinger.” The program will also include other spy movie favorites, such as “Sooner or Later” from *Dick Tracy*, the “Inspector Clouseau Theme” from *The Pink Panther*, and “Soul Bossa Nova” from the *Austin Powers* films. Broadway vocalist and Tony Award-winner Debbie Gravitte will join the Orchestra for many of the evening’s musical selections.

The James Bond-themed program celebrates the 50th anniversary of the first James Bond movie, “Dr. No,” which was released in 1962.
